

Soy sourcing data

COFCO International recognizes traceability as prerequisite to sustainable soy supply chains.

We commit to reach full traceability to farm level for direct sourcing in the 25 priority municipalities. This is in line with our objective to reach farm-level traceability for all direct sourcing activities in Brazil over time.

Meanwhile, we are starting engagement with indirect suppliers on our requirements for farm-level traceability, with the intention to improve transparency of this part of our soy supply chain. This would allow better supply base monitoring and supplier engagement when needed. Aware that traceability itself is not the end goal, we plan to further focus our supply chain

management efforts, on regions with higher exposure to environmental and social challenges – including native vegetation conversion. These efforts will be guided by the outcomes of the environmental and social risk mapping for the Cerrado biome we conducted earlier this year (see the [Soft Commodities Forum June 2019 Report](#)).

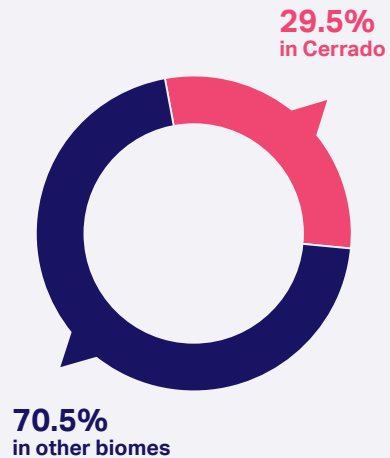

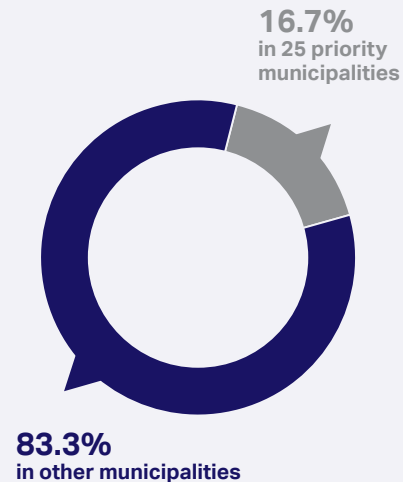

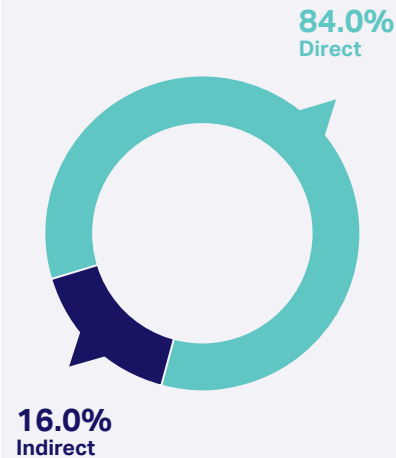
Soy volume sourced in Brazil
